The manger, the star, the dark winter night reminded us of Christmas.

The three crosses on a hill tell us about the death of Jesus among two criminals.

The cup with wine and the Holy Eucharist bring Jesus to us today when we go to Mass and welcome Him in our hearts by receiving Him in Holy Communion.

When we walked to Bethlehem back in December, we got to know the story of Jesus' birth. Today we walk again with Jesus and will come to know about four days in Jesus' life. We remember these days as Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Silent Saturday and Easter Sunday.

Let us be still, listen and become aware of how much Jesus loves us. Let us walk in a prayerful way in the footsteps of Jesus, knowing that he is walking with us every day of our lives.

## LAST SUPPER

Celebrating the liberation of God's people, Jesus is having a meal with his Twelve chosen friends. Before the meal he knelt down and washed the feet of all twelve. Then he said: "I am giving an example to follow." With this gesture and these words Jesus is showing his disciples to be good and helpful to others and not to be afraid to do the humble tasks. Then he sits down at the table, during the meal, he takes the bread and says: "This is my body broken for you". Then he takes the cup of wine and says: "This is my blood pour out for you. Do this to remember me".

Jesus' words may be difficult to understand

-Where do we hear these words today?

As we walk with Jesus, we will come to understand better the meaning of his words, and we will see how his words become real as he gives his body and shares his blood and suffers so much pain in love for us.

## FEAR

During the meal, Judas, one of the friends of Jesus left the table and walked out... Darkness has fallen.

Then he went a bit further and prayed in fear and trembling: "Father, let this cup of suffering pass away from me. Father not my will but yours be done".

He went back to his friends, but they were asleep. "Come", he said, "this is the hour of darkness, the time has come". Then Judas came to the garden and betrayed Jesus with a greeting and a kiss. Jesus was taken to prison.

In our lives we sometimes have difficult tasks ahead of us. Do I pray for strength like Jesus did?

Mother Teresa of Kolkata said "do small things with great love". Yes, you can do it, small things in love for others, and Jesus' love will fill your hearts.

Jesus strokes his mother's face. The mother shares in the pain of her son. The son shares in the pain of his mother.

We thank you for our mothers, fathers, grandparents and all those who help us when we are sad or experience pain.

We pray for children who do not receive the love of a mother.

Jesus help me to be good to my mum, dad, and all those who care for me. Amen

# NAILED

Have my hands ever been fists in order to hurt someone?

Jesus help me to bring healing and love with my hands and let goodness win in every situation. Amen

## DIED

Jesus is hanging upon the cross, his strength is ebbing away. He is coming to the end and soon will die. The soldiers seem to be so indifferent. Their minds are already on gain, as they start playing a game of throwing dice for his garments. Others pass by and shout insults at Jesus. Only very few are at the foot of the cross, standing by Jesus in his last hour: his mother, John the disciple and another woman.

Have you ever been insensitive to someone's pain or even added to their pain by making fun of them?

One of the two criminals turns to Jesus saying Jesus remember me and Jesus promises him eternal life with him in heaven that same day.

Jesus, teach me to turn to you for help Amen

### 3. WOMAN THIS IS YOUR SON, SON THIS IS YOUR MOTHER.

Speaking these words to John, Jesus is giving us his mother, and he also entrusts us as sons and daughters to his mother.

Hail Mary full of Grace...

#### 4. <u>FATHER FORGIVE THEM FOR THEY DO NOT KNOW WHAT</u> <u>THEY DO.</u>

Jesus prays to His Father for all those who have hurt him.

Jesus, help me not to be afraid to say sorry and to ask for forgiveness. Amen.

#### 5. I AM THIRSTY

#### 7. IT IS ACCOMPLISHED.

Jesus says, "It is accomplished," then he bows his head and dies.
